Before the Storm

- Sill up your vehicle(s) with gas
- Take a 360 degree video around your home and property as well as contents inside
- Ensure your Emergency Preparedness Supply List and Go Kit are stocked
- Secure your home to include outdoor furniture, potted plants and decorations
- Fill up bathtub and sinks with water for cleaning and sanitation use

Your Hurricane Preparedness Supply is a list of items that, while we hope you never need to use, will be helpful if there is damage from a severe Hurricane that causes power outages, physical damage to homes and landscape as well as flooding. As Hurricanes in Florida can turn one way or another relatively quickly, it is a good idea to keep yourself fully stocked year round to avoid the mad rush of local residents attempting to grab essentials, out of stock high demand items and an increase of price of items in demand.
