Before the Storm

- 🌀 Fill up your vehicle(s) with gas
- 🌀 Take a 360 degree video around your home and property as well as contents inside
- 🌀 Ensure your Emergency Preparedness Supply List and Go Kit are stocked
- 🌀 Secure your home to include outdoor furniture, potted plants and decorations
- 🌀 Fill up bathtub and sinks with water for cleaning and sanitation use



Your Hurricane Preparedness Supply is a list of items that, while we hope you never need to use, will be helpful if there is damage from a severe Hurricane that causes power outages, physical damage to homes and landscape as well as flooding. As Hurricanes in Florida can turn one way or another relatively quickly, it is a good idea to keep yourself fully stocked year round to avoid the mad rush of local residents attempting to grab essentials, out of stock high demand items and an increase of price of items in demand.

PREPAREDNESS SUPPLY LIST

- ☐ 3 DAY SUPPLY OF DRINKABLE WATER (RECOMMENDATION IS 1 GALLON PER PERSON PER DAY)
- ☐ 3 DAY SUPPLY OF NON PERISHABLE FOOD AND SNACKS
(CANNED ITEMS SUCH AS TUNA, VEGETABLES, FRUITS, SOUPS AS WELL AS OTHER ITEMS THAT DO NOT REQUIRE REFRIGERATION SUCH AS PEANUT BUTTER, BREAD, CEREAL ETC.)
- ☐ 3 DAY SUPPLY OF FOOD FOR ALL PETS
- ☐ BLEACH (UNSCENTED) AND MEDICINE DROPPER TO PURIFY WATER (8 DROPS PER GALLON)
- ☐ BATTERY-OPERATED RADIO
- ☐ BATTERY POWERED FAN
- ☐ BATTERIES
- ☐ CELL PHONE PORTABLE CHARGER
- ☐ MANUAL CAN OPENER
- ☐ DISPOSABLE EATING UTENSILS
- ☐ DUCT TAPE
- ☐ BASIC TOOL KIT
- ☐ MOSQUITO REPELLENT
- ☐ FIRE EXTINGUISHER
- ☐ FLASH LIGHT FOR EACH PERSON
- ☐ GAS GRILL OR STERNO (OUTDOOR USE ONLY)
- ☐ BACK UP PROPANE
- ☐ MATCHES OR LIGHTER
- ☐ POCKET KNIFE
- ☐ CARDS, BOARD GAMES & BOOKS
- ☐ NON PRESCRIPTION MEDICATIONS
- ☐ STOCKED GO KIT

Your Hurricane Go Kit should ideally be placed in a water tight storage container and be available to grab and go should you need to have to evacuate or choose to hunker down in the safest area of your home. Hurricanes in Florida can change course and strength quickly and preparedness is key.

- ☐ FLASH LIGHT
- ☐ PET ITEMS SUCH AS COLLAR AND LEASH

After the Storm

-  Do not go outside until all clear has been given
-  Take a 360 degree video around your home and property as well as contents inside
-  Report any downed wires – do not approach even if they appear to be dead
-  Do not step or wade through standing water
-  Check on your neighbors
